- Fun Fact: The reason PURPLE became a royal color....In the 16th century, a precious treasure emerged from the Mediterranean Sea: Murex brandaris, a type of sea snail. During the Bronze Age, the sea snails were used to make purple dye, also known as "Royal" or "Imperial" purple. To create the dye, a yellow fluid was extracted from the snails and exposed to light until it turned a brilliant shade of purple. It took up to 12,000 mollusks to produce just 1 gram of dye, and Murex snails became worth their weight in gold. At the time, 1 pound of Tyrian purple wool cost more than what most people made in a year, so the only members of society who could afford the color were nobility and royalty. Not only did rulers wear purple, but they also signed their documents with purple ink. The saying "born in the purple" denotes a noble birth, and children of high-ranking citizens wore purple. Purple finally became widely available to the masses after British chemist William Henry Perkin invented the world's first commercial synthetic purple dye in 1856.

Purple continues its royal distinction in many royal traditions and ceremonies. At competitions and fairs around the world, purple is used in purple grand champion ribbons being awarded to the very best in the contest. In the novel and movie, "The Color Purple," the color is used to symbolize dignity, elegance, and authority. The elevation of purple to "royal" is thanks to a lowly snail.
