#### • Facts a Solar Eclipse:

- The longest duration for a total solar eclipse possible is 7.5 minutes.
- $\circ~$  During this eclipse the shadow of the Moon races across the Earth at 2410 mph in western Oregon down
- to 1502 mph near Chareston, SC.
- $\circ\,$  A partial solar eclipses can be seen up to 3,000 miles from the "track" of totality.
- $\circ~$  Lunar Eclipses Only Occur During a Full Moon.
- $\circ$  'Syzygy' Is the Term for When the Earth, Sun and Moon Align.

• There Are Three Types of Lunar Eclipse... A lunar eclipse can be total, partial or penumbral. A total eclipse happens when the shadow of the Earth fully covers the moon. A partial eclipse (pictured above) is when the Earth's shadow covers just a portion of the moon. A penumbral eclipse involves the Earth's lighter outer shadow (penumbra) covers the moon. Penumbral shadows often go unnoticed by casual sky watchers.

 $\circ$  'Totality' Is the Term for When the Moon Is Completely Darkened.

 $_{\odot}\,$  The moon looks reddish, often called a blood moon, during an eclipse because of the way light is refracted in the Earth's atmosphere.
